In view of the immediate commencement of several important public works, including the establishment of the electric Istreet railway system, the reclamation of Ashbridge's Bay and the Esplanade improvements (with all the details of which Mr. Cuningham is fully conversant, and the vigorous prosecution of which is essential to the prosperity or the city and to the welfare and convenience of the citizens) your committee is of opinion that serious injury will result to the city from the loss of Mr. Cuningham's reviews at this juncture in its affairs. They trust, therefore, that your Worship and the council will recognize the wisdom of not accepting Mr. Cuningham's resignation and of appointing him to the position of City Engineer.
