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STUDENTS MUST PAY THEIR FINES.

Varsity Council Declines to Alter its Decision Regarding Those Duly of Halloway's Friends.

The Council of Toronto University have resolved that their decision on the case of the six students charged with damaging University property shall not be altered.

The students were busy all the week organizing some kind of resistance. A committee consisting of Messrs. Gillies, Fry and Boutilas was appointed to present the names of 647 students, and bring the matter before the council.

The president summoned a special meeting last night to consider the appeal. The case was presented, but the arguments brought forth by the students did not affect any change in the judgment.

Letter to the committee states that the council believes that the injury inflicted on the University is too serious to justify the council in the reduction any portion of the \$15.

The council, however, corrected an impression which the students had formed, and explained that the money was not levied as a fine. They said that the University was unable to bear such a loss, and that these six students pay or collect for them this sum.

The committee offered to raise the sum by subscription, but the council rejected the proposal.

It is not known yet whether the boys will come forth and pay the required sum. Mr. H. A. Bruce came up yesterday, paid his fine and then expressed his sympathy with the university and has entered Trinity.
