The casting of the bronze portions of the Macdonald memorial for Montreal is proceeding as rapidly as possible, in view of the intricate character of much of the work, and Mr. Wade, the sculptor, quite expects that it will be ready for ship-ment in March or April. Of course he is largely in the hands of the casters and the work is of a nature that can-not very well be hurried. The statue to be erected at Kingston is also well in hand. It is a replica of that intended for Montreal and the clay model met with the entire approval of the Baroness Macdonald. The Kingston memorial will consist of a statue and pedestal, and will not be nearly as extensive or as or-nate as the Montreal memorial. Mr. Reynolds Stephens, the sculptor who received the commission for the bust of Mr. Peter Redpath, to be placed in the library at McGill, has completed the work, and Mrs. Redpath, who has seen it, is thoroughly satisfied.
