## MORE POLICEMEN FOR HAMILTON

The Force to be Strengthened by Four Men—Two Aldermen and a Lady Will be Summoned.

Hamilton, Oct. 22.—The Police Commissioners met this afternoon and decided to add four men, making the total strength of the force 55 men. A meeting will be held on Oct. 31 for the appointment of the men. A resolution was passed that policemen reaching the age of 55 shall be retired. This will affect P.C. Ferris and P.C. Vark, but they will not be retired at once, and as they are the first this regulation affects, and thus for the next year the force will be 55 strong. The rule making it necessary for applicants to be residents of the province one year prior to appointment was amended.

In view of the charges made by Ald. Lees and Mrs. Day Smith, and that the Police Commissioners have interfered with the enforcement of the law, a meeting will be held on Friday evening, to which the two aldermen and Mrs. Smith will be summoned, and made to prove the accusations they have made, and divulge the names of the policemen who told them they did not report gambling, because they received no encouragement from the Police Commissioners. A dismissal of certain policemen is looked forward to.

Dundas Mayor Assailed.

Mayor Knowles of Dundas was assailed yesterday because he refused to give a tramp assistance. The tramp, who is a big, powerful man, and said he was a Guelph butcher, went into the mayor's office, and when the Mayor gave him an hour to leave town, he jumped onto him. The Mayor and the tramp struggled till one of the Mayor's clerks separated them. The tramp, who gave his name as McDonald, was tried and sentenced to six months in the county jail.

An Alleged Slanderer.

A member of the W.C.T.U. is alleged to have stated that a recent addition to the St. Nicholas Hotel was being used for immoral purposes, and now Proprietors Smith and McLean have placed the matter in their hands and will take action against the woman for slander.

A Thirty Pound Tumor.

Dr. Cummings recently performed a remarkable operation on Miss Oates, who resides near the cemetery, over the mountain. He removed a tumor from her weighing 30 pounds. The young woman has for years suffered from the tumor, and doctors stated she could live but a short time if it was not removed.

Registration of Horses Under the New Act.

Yesterday a deputation consisting of Messrs. Robert Smith, John West, Durham, president of the Hackney Association; Mr. Robert Davies, president of the Clydesdale Horse Association; Capt. David McGee, president of the Polled Angus Cattle Association; Mr. Robert Graham of Clarendon, Dr. Smith, V.S., and Mr. Henry Wade, secretary of the Agriculture and Arts Association, waited upon Hon. John Dryden, Minister of Agriculture. An act was passed during the last session of the Provincial Parliament doing away with the Agriculture and Arts Association, which functions will henceforth be performed by the above and other societies. The object of the deputation was to settle the fees to be charged horsemen for recording pedigrees under the new management. The matter will be definitely settled at a future interview. Mr. H. Wade will act as registrar under the new regime and the Government is having an office ready for him on the upper flat of the Parliament building.

The Rug Sale.

The sale of Oriental rugs and fancy goods conducted by C. M. Henderson & Co. yesterday afternoon at King street east was largely attended by connoisseurs and anxious to secure some of these beautiful wares. Mr. Henderson deserves credit for the sale in which the goods were displayed and the sale conducted, every article being offered without reserve and at a price which was the lowest catalogue. Some of the prices were very fair and others were undoubtedly bargains for the purchasers. The highest price obtained was for a silk mohair carpet, which brought \$185, the purchaser being Mr. Scott of the Georgian Bay Lumber Company. The sale will be continued this morning at 11 o'clock and in the afternoon as well, when some of the most valuable carpets and rugs will be put up. They are certainly worthy the attention of the public.

Scarboro's Centenary.

A meeting of the inhabitants of Scarborough, County of York, will be held at Woburn to-day to arrange for the celebration of the 100th anniversary of the settlement of the township, which will occur in June, 1896. It has been mooted that a good way to celebrate the event would be the erection of a monument to David Thompson, the first settler, who located in the township in 1792, and gave the ground for a church and burying ground, which overlooks the site occupied by the first mill.

Bishop Dudley of Kentucky.

Bishop Dudley of Kentucky, described as the most eloquent bishop on this continent, will be in Toronto for Saturday and Sunday next in connection with the Ontario convention of the Episcopate of St. Andrew. Saturday evening he will speak at an open meeting in St. James' schoolhouse; Sunday afternoon in Association Hall and that evening in St. James' Cathedral.
