THE COMMONS AND THE SCOTT ACT.

The order for the concurrence in the amendment made by the Senate of this Dominion, in the Scott Act came up for debate in the Commons on the 18th inst. The first amendment was that to the 5th section, which provides that duty imposed medicinal liquors for medicinal purposes only. After a spirited debate the amendment was carried by a vote of 54 to 15.
