One candled lemon or orange, a little mixed spice, a littlesalt and a good grate of ginger; beat four eggs, make a hole in your ingredients to the bottom of the bowl, stir in the eggs smoothly, beat well; then add milk enough to make it into a consistency sufficiently thick to allow of the pudding spoon standing upright, which is the criterion of the quantity of milk to be used; add a wineglass of trandy, butter a large bowl and steam three hours one day, and two when wanted. For boiling, three hours and a half will do. A heaplur teaspoonful of Cook's Friend must be mixed in the flour.
