

Exorcising the GHOST of SIGNET-C2 (or GHOST-BUSTING in C2) at Headquarters

Have you ever received a visitation from the ghost of SIGNET-C2? It haunts you after you have exited Local Mail, but when you try to re-open it, it doesn't open; instead, you receive a dialogue box that tells you, Local Mail Already Running. You do an Alt + Tab until the Local Mail pop-up box appears; you let go of Alt + Tab, but Local Mail still does not open. Why? It is because when you exited the Local Mail - Send Mail window by double-clicking on the drop-down button in the top right hand

corner of the screen, it didn't completely exit Local Mail - its "ghost" is still there.

To prevent the ghost from appearing, always click on the Close button to exit the Local Mail - Send Mail window, then double-click on the drop-down button in the top right hand corner of the screen or click on the Exit button to exit Local Mail.

If the ghost is present, you don't have to logout to get rid of it, just follow these steps:

- Press Ctrl + Esc to bring up the Task List dialogue box.
- Click once on Local Mail 1.2d to select or highlight it.
- Click on the End Task button.
- Click once on Program Manager to select or highlight it.
- Click on the Switch To button

You may now use the SIGNET-C2 local Mail icon to start Local Mail.

Remove "Save Settings on Login" When Using Another Computer

The IBIsys window has an option to **Save Setting on Login**. This means that it will retain the last Login Name and Server Name. When you use someone else's workstation, you may not want your name and server overriding their settings; therefore, before login, remove the **Save Setting on Login**. After you've logged out, the settings will return to what they were originally.
