Mr. Baldwin: Mr. Speaker, I would make this proposition. It is now six o'clock. It is not an unreasonable amendment at all. I would be perfectly prepared to withdraw it if I could get a commitment or undertaking. The Minister of Agriculture and the President of the Privy Council have been becoming a little more generous in giving undertakings. If I could receive an undertaking from the government that within a limited time it will implement the provisions of the third report of the Committee on Statutory Instruments, although I would have to consult my colleagues I would be inclined to give serious consideration to withdrawing the amendment. If that is not done, I would have to insist on

Your Honour making a ruling, because I would then have no more faith in the intentions of this government regarding the report of this committee.

Mr. Olson: Mr. Speaker, this is another of those instances where the hon. member for Peace River wants to attach conditions that are clearly out of order and which have nothing to do with—
