(c) What ships of our navy were placed at the disposal of the authorities in connection with the care of the one who by turns seems to have been declared affected with gastro enteritis, typhoid fever, Asiatic cholera, and who seems to be treated to-day as a cholera carrier and a victim of insanity?

2. Does this sum of \$625,000 include (a) the amount and what amount for the construction of a deep water wharf at Levis?

(b) the amount and what amount for the completion of the works actually under contract in connection with the estuary of the St. Charles river.

3. Out of this sum of \$625,000 what are the amounts specially intended:

(a) for the construction of the locks on the St. Charles river;

(b) for the deepening of the St. Charles river itself, from its mouth to Bickell bridge?

By the Honourable Sir George Ross:—

May 18.—That when the Order of the Day is called for the Third Reading of (Bill 150), "An Act to authorize the Government of Canada to acquire, by lease, a certain line of railway in the Province of New Brunswick," he will move that the said Bill be not now read a third time, but that it be amended as follows:—

"That the words 'and with the Government of the Province of New Brunswick,' in line 15, and also the words 'to the said Province of New Brunswick,' in line 21, be struck out of the Bill."
