At the close of the meeting of the governors yesterday afternoon, it was stated by members of the corporation that this appointment had been under discussion, but the governors considered that until the time came, on Wednesday, for an official announcement, no definite statement could be made. Despatches from Ottawa stated yesterday that the probability of General Sir Arthur Currie's appoint-ment to the principalship of McGill University had been mooted, but that General Currie had declined to discuss the matter in its present position.
