while his work as staff-officer in London was proof of his administrative ability.

In my judgment Mr. Cavenagh's keen and enlightened interest in education, his unusual gifts as a lecturer and a writer, and not least his personal qualities make him a strong candidate for a Chair of Education. Both my colleagues and myself would greatly regret his departure. He is a man to whom both colleagues and students become attached, and I personally should much miss his leyal help and stimulating influence. At the same time we feel that he deserves a post of wider responsibility.
