Not only the province, whose produce and description have been more particularly attended to, but Canada, and the extensive territories upon the lake, the population of which is very great, and is hourly encreasing, must receive all their supplies of cloathing, &c. from England: To which may be added, a large and valuable trade with all the nations of the .
