on Sunday. I hope the way may be clear to place the Parish School ere long under a Deacon, who will be able to assist in the Parish work. The Church needs to be restored or renewed, but has to wait with other work till we have an increase in funds and laborers.

Adderley has suffered more than any other part of the Parish by the removal of Church families. The fortnightly Sunday service has been fairly attended and the interest in

Church work kept up.

We have been cheered by the visit of the Bishop for confirmation and Missionary meeting. The Rev. Rural Dean Fothergill and Rev. T. S. Chapman, of Dudswell, attended our Missionary meeting and delivered addresses. The Rev. Professor Roe also spent a few days visiting some of the families in the Parish and no doubt improved the opportunity.
