

AUSTRIA HAS CALLED OUT
ALMOST HER LAST MAN

Reservists Have to Leave Harvest
Fields to Age of Forty.

Canadian Press Despatch.

LONDON, Aug. 21.—(7.57 p.m.)—In a despatch from Amsterdam the correspondent of the Reuter Telegram Co. transmits an official communication from Vienna saying that a new mobilization order calls all the reservists of the first class, now at work harvesting, as well as the men in the land-sturm, to the colors for Aug. 24. The first and second class of the Hungarian landwehr have been ordered to mobilize on the same date, as have also the recruits of 1914, and all the men in the Austrian and Hungarian landsturm up to the age of 40 years.
