" and finally charging your Majesty's said "Governor and Lieutenant-Governor with " having been among the chief instruss ments of introducing a fleet and an army " into that Province, to establish and per-" petuate their plans, whereby your Ma-" jesty's said Governor and Lieutenant-"Governor have been not only greatly " instrumental of disturbing the peace and "harmony of the government, and cauf-" ing unnatural and hateful discords and animolities between the several parts of " your Majesty's extensive dominions, but " are justly chargeable with all that cor-"ruption of morals, and all that confu-" fion, mifery, and bloodshed, which se have been the natural effects of posting " an army in a populous town."—But the Lords of the Committee cannot but exf press their astonishment, that a charge of fo ferious and extensive a nature against the persons, whom the said House of Representatives acknowledge by their faid petition to have heretofore had the confidence and esteem of the people, and to have been advanced by your Majesty from the purest motives of rendering your subjects happy, to the highest places f of trust and authority in that Province, "fhould
