should we be able to effect it, she must after all drive ashore from the violence of the wind, being unable to fet any more fail to bear up against it. Our opinion, however, was rejected, and an attempt was made to brace about the fore yard, but it was . Jund impracticable, the ropes and blocks being covered with ice. were therefore obliged to let it remain as before, and the water having fuddenly changed its colour, we expected the ship to strike every instant. Small as our expectations were of faving our lives, I thought it incumbent on me to take every precaution to fave the dispatches I was charged with, and therefore ordered my fervant to open my trunks, and collect all the letters they contained, which I put into a handkerchief, and tied it about my waist. He at the same time offered me fome money, to the amount of one hundred and eighty guineas, which I desired him to dispose of as he thought proper, thinking it in the present emergency rather an incumbrance than a matter worthy of preservation.
