Wheat in France.

The Corn Trade News shows that the net deliveries of wheat and flour for consumption in France for the year ending July 31. 1898, amounted to \$1,744,000 bushels, of which 41,702,000 bushels, or over one-half, were taken in the three months of May, June and July. The Minister of Agriculture estamated that nearly 30 million bushels of wheat were carried over from crop of 1896. He estimated the wheat crop of 1897 244 million bushels. The stocks of foreign and domestic wheat at harvest of 1897 244 million bushels. The stocks of foreign and domestic wheat at harvest of 1898 were reduced to a minimum. It is evident that notwithstanding the high prices of 1897-98, the consumption of wheat was about of average quantity. In Nebraska. The Nebraska Grain Dealers' Association makes the wheat crop of that State from 45 ao 55 million bushels. The Washington estimate in August was 32,604,000 bushels.
