A. J. Balfour's Speech Shows to Do But Fight.

Dundee, Scotland, Sept. 28 .- On receiving the freedom of the city of Dundee to-day, Mr. A. J. Balfour, the First Lord of the Treasury and Government leader in the House of Commons, said the Government had longed for and had striven for a peaceful and honorable solution of the perennial South African difficulty, and, "if that honorable solent does not prove a peaceful solution the fault rests on other heads than ours."


