ROSS PLANS R. R. GAMEY'S ARREST ON A SERIOUS PERSONAL CHARGE

Influence of Manitoulin Man In North Renfrew Fight Said to Be Motive for Spectacular Move—Alleged Charge Has No Relation to Game of Politics.

GOVERNMENT FEARS OUTCOME OF THE PENDING BY-ELECTION.

Fear, amounting almost to a positive belief that North Renfrew will elect the opposition candidate has caused the Ross government to consider a spectacular move. This is nothing less than the arrest of R. R. Gamey on a serious personal charge not related to politics. Within the past twenty-four hours the advisability of arresting Gamey has been the subject of keen discussion among certain members of the Ross government and some who enjoy their confidence. The situation is regarded as desperate. Gamey, the shrewdest friends of the government declare, has materially strengthened the opposition candidate. There is no reason to believe that the charge which is to be made the pretext for Gamey's arrest is well founded.
