PARIS, Dec. 5. — Reports received here from Zurich assert that after the second battle of the Somme in 1916, Crown Prince Rupprecht of Bavaria declared himself openly in favor of an immediate peace. The reports say he addressed a memorandum to this effect both to the imperial chancellor and the then Emperor William.

The Zurich reports say that it is further averred that Rupprecht manifested violent opposition to Gen. Ludendorff, first quartermaster - general, whom Rupprecht considered to be without any strategical manius whatever.
