son of Sir Barnes Peacock, read on behalf of the privy council in the case of *Hodge v. The Queen*, which says: "When the British North America Act enacted that there should be a legislature for Ontario, and that its legislative assembly should have exclusive authority to make laws for the province and for provincial purposes in relation to the matters enumerated in section 92, it conferred powers not in any sense
