---Canadians Shove Outposts Forward 1,000 Yards Near Lens.

NEGROES SLAIN, HOUSES BURNED IN RACIAL WAR

Estimate of Seventy-Five Lives Lost in East St. Louis. BIG PROPERTY LOSS Torch Applied to Four Settlements—Three Million Dollars Damage.

New York, July 2.—Despatches to the Associated Press at midnight indicate that an estimate that 250 negroes were killed in a race riot in East St. Louis, Ill., was much exaggerated.

Tonight's rioting began after a white man had been shot by a band of blacks. A mob which quickly gathered, applied the torch to rows of colored mansions.

London, July 2.—Lord Derby, secretary of war, in a statement to the Associated Press today, said: "The arrival in France of the troops of the United States to take their place by the side of the French, Belgian and British troops, is an event of the first importance."

British and German Airmen Fall in a Battle to Death

Amsterdam, July 2.—The Frankfurter Zeitung, reporting the death of the German aviator Reisinger, who had previously accounted for four adversaries, says that during his last flight he succeeded in setting fire to his British opponent's machine, but the latter seeing he was unable to escape death, rammed Reisinger's airplane and both airmen fell to earth.
