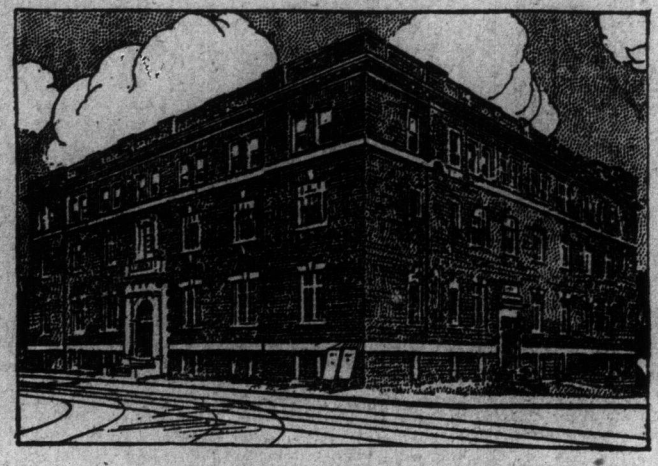
An Army of Y.M.C.A. Workers Lays Siege to Toronto Wednesday Morning Help Us All You Can—We Appeal to All Men

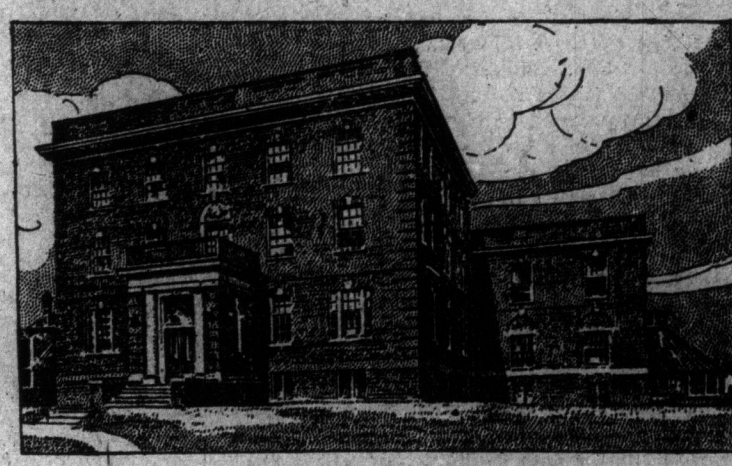

GIVE PUBLIC PLANS OF HOTEL SHORTLY

Present Particulars of Toronto's New Palatial Building to Directors.

UP-TO-DATE HOUSE

Promises to Be One of Finest in Size, Service and Appointment on Continent.

Important action on the hotel that is to be erected on the site of the Yonge street arcade at a total cost of four millions, may be expected shortly. This announcement was made Monday evening after a long conference between the president of the company that is to operate the hotel and Mr. W. S. Dunlop, who is most active of the Toronto men interested in the erection of the building.

SUBURBAN ROADS AREA IDEA ADOPTED BY CITIES
Highways Department to Defray Forty Per Cent. of Kingston System.
Windsor, Kitchener and Galt, as well as Kingston, which led the way, are adopting the "suburban road area" idea under the Highways Act which came into effect in January of this year. A. M. Rankin, M.L.A. for Frontenac, was in consultation with the highways department yesterday with regard to the details of the Kingston arrangement. The radius of the suburban road area at Kingston is 45 miles. Under a commission composed of Mr. Rankin, W. J. Fair, secretary-treasurer, and J. S. Sibbette, the province will defray 40 per cent. of the cost of road construction, the city 30 per cent., and the county 30 per cent.

Another Motor Car Fatality
Wm. Innis Dies of Injuries
While crossing the intersection at Bolton Ave. and Cummings St. about 10.30 Saturday night, William Innis, aged 58, 40 Allen street, was struck and fatally injured by a motor car driven by Fred Gibson, 25 Grant street. He died at his home yesterday morning. The body was removed to the morgue, where an inquest will be held.
When struck Innis was hurled to the pavement and picked up in a semi-conscious condition. After being attended by Dr. East, East Queen street, he was removed to his home. Innis was married, and was employed by the street cleaning department.
Seven Hundred Thousand From Motor Car Licenses
Revenue from motor licenses will approximate \$700,000 this year, it is estimated. There are probably 55,000 automobiles in the province. If the average license cost were \$12, this would give a revenue of \$660,000. Various other items will swell this amount probably to \$700,000, possibly \$750,000.

TORONTO BATTALIONS ARRIVE IN ENGLAND
Regiments Under Lieut.-Col. Wright and Lieut.-Col. Mitchell Cross Safely.
Ottawa, Oct. 30.—It is officially announced that the chief press censor's office that the following troops have arrived safely in England:
The 155th, 156th, 157th and 160th Ontario Battalions. Balance of the 166th Ontario Battalion, half of the 159th Ontario Battalion, and drafts of Strathcona Horse, 96th Battalion and Medical Corps.
The 169th Battalion left Niagara Camp on Oct. 7, and passed thru Toronto in two trains in the evening of the same day, under command of Lt.-Col. Jesse G. Wright.
The 166th Battalion, under Lt.-Col. W. G. Mitchell, left Camp Borden four days later. They passed thru North Toronto station the same evening.
