Report of Men's Association.

The EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE held seven meetings during the past year, at which all business of the Association was transacted.

The reports of the various branches of the Dorset Mission work, presented herewith, show that the labours of the workers in the different departments have been attended with a large measure of success.

The Association accepted with regret the resignation of Mr. James Strachan, who so ably and faithfully filled the position of Superintendent of the Night School. He was succeeded for a short time by Mr. Wilbur Henderson. The duties of this important position are now discharged by Mr. S. Moore.

At the close of its seventh year's business, the Penny Savings Bank shows a larger amount to the credit of depositors than at any previous time in its history.
