The number of newspapers published in the United States and Territories in 1839, was 1555. Of this number there were published in New York 274; Pennsylvannia 253; Ohio 164; and Massachusetts 124; together, more than half the whole number. In each of the cities of New York and Philadelphia there were 71—a larger number than in any of the States, except those above mentioned. In Boston there were 65; Cincinnatti 27; New Orleans 10; the State of Louisiana 26; Baltimore 20; Washington 11; and Richmond 10.

It is stated that of all new-born infants, one out of four dies the first year; three-fifths only attain the sixth year; and, before the twenty-second year, nearly one-half the generation is consigned to the grave. Attained to the age of maturity, 1 out of every 30 or 40 individuals die annually.
