The Branch Lines Bill - General Matters in the House of Com-

Ottawa, March 26-The resolutions dealing with over issues of dominion notes were first disposed of in the House

notes were first disposed of in the House of Commons today.

Hon. Frank Cochrane then introduced his resolution to authorize the minister of railways to construct, lease, or acquire any railway, or railway work in Quebec, New Brunswick Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, not over 200 miles in length, to form part of the government railway system.

The resolution also ratifies an agreement for the purchase of the International Railway Company of New Brunswick from Campbellton to St. Leonard's, a distance of 112 miles, for \$27,00,000, and provides that, pending the payment of the purchase one one, the railway may be leased for \$90,000 per year; and another for the purchase of the New Brunswick & Prince Edward Island Company, from Sackville (N. B.), to Cape Tormentine, thirty-six miles, for \$270,0000, interest to be paid on the purchase price, until it is paid, at four per cent, per annum.
