Ottawa, Oct. 23—"Absurd," was the epithet of A. R. Mosher, grand president of the Canadian Brotherhood of Railway Employes when asked today for his opinion of the edict of President D. B. Hanna, of the Canadian National Railway that the employes of the road are debarred from taking political action of any kind.

"If this order remains effective it will mean that a considerable percentage of our citizenship will have no political voice," said Mr. Mosher. He said that while members of the C. B. R. E. employed on the government lines, and other employes were absolutely opposed to having the expression of their political opinions suppressed, they would not violate the order.
