## GALE OF 52 MILES, AND

Cleveland, March 16—With one tug and its crew of eight men missing lost, and two others missing, it is feared the gale of yesterday took heavy toll in human life on Lake Erie.

The tug Silver Spray, of Erie, Ps., foundered early this morning in a violent gale and the eight men aboard were drowned. Two other tugs are missing, and it is the opinion of lake men, that they have met the breakwater sending spray high in the air. Inside the harbor white caps make the same fate as Captain Purdy's Silver Spray. The missing tugs are:—The Lloyd May and the Swan.

Captain Cornelius of the tug Buckeye today reported that he sighted a pilot house and two bodies floating in the lake off East 40th street.





A RUNAWAY ENGINE


