Should Canadiens defeat St. Pats in the semi-finals, they will meet Hamilton here in the first game of the finals next Monday, with the second game at Hamilton next Wednesday. If Canadiens are beaten out, St. Patricks will enter the final against Hamilton. Arrangements for the finals will be made between the two clubs, though it is between the two clubs, though it is known that if at all possible Hamilton would prefer to play the first game of the finals away from home.

To Play At Arena

There was much speculation as to where the local play off would be staged, with both the Arena and the Forum available. 


