Ramblers Take Four.


In a match on Black's alleys last night, the Ramblers took all the four points from the Maples, showing a superiority all through. The individual scores were as follows:

New York, April 3—Not only did

American dollars pay for the dyestuffs

brought to America by the German sub-

marine merchantman Deutschland on

her sensational voyages, but the profit

Colonel Herman A. Metz, former com-

ptroller of New York city, who was a
