**WHY PEOPLE JOIN SOCIETIES**  
(London Times)  
A witness the other day, no doubt desiring to impress the courts, said that she had formed a society. She may not have known that in doing so she was merely following a natural instinct of the human race and one that is at present particularly powerful. Those who form a society, no matter what its object may be, often feel that they are making history by drawing up rules, electing officers, and passing resolutions. Their proceedings get a solemnity from the fact that they are the proceedings of a society which they could not get in any other way. Usually, too, those who start the society become its first officers, and they feel that they have gained in status by that fact. They have made a little world in which they are comrades, and, lucky for them, it is possible to find rank and file for almost any society, those mysterious, patient people who will go to any meeting, listen to any speech, and vote for or against any resolution.

Societies are apt to be infected by fanatics other than those who found them and who enter them with the object of differing from the founders and officials. The point on which they differ may be invisible to any one but themselves, but they have joined the society to insist on it, and they do so to the dismay of the founders who expect to do all the talking. Such fanatics usually have a malign skill in details of procedure and in the wording of resolutions. They rise to a point of order and use all the arts of obstruction in the policy of the society; in fact, the founders and officials are their natural prey, just as the patient listeners are the natural prey of the founders and officials. Perhaps nature has also intended them to keep the number of societies down. There is a natural balance of such things, and those who fanatics would kill each other instead of proposing votes of censure.

But, as things are, societies form a harmless vent for their animal passions. They also convey to a number of people, who feel that something ought to be done about something, the impression that something is being done at last.
