will be paid under the following conditions by the above company to the legal representative of any person over 16 and under 65 years of age, killed by an accident to any public conveyance of a common carrier using steam, electricity or cable as a motive power, whilst riding as an ordinary passenger, or being a passenger, or who shall have been fatally injured as a result of such accident should result, independently of all other causes, within 90 days from the date of such accident, and the sum of

will be paid under the same conditions should such accident not prove fatal, but result in the loss of both arms or both legs, or of one arm and a leg, by actual separation above the wrist or ankle, or the irreparable loss of sight of both eyes, such loss in any case resulting independently of all other causes, within 90 days from the date of such accident.

Provided that at the time of such accident the person so killed or injured was the owner of the policy or other person in which this coupon is inserted; that such person had paid the fee for registration, and that notice of claim is sent to the Head Office of the Company at Toronto within fourteen days of the occurrence of the accident, and that such claim be made within twelve months of the registration of the holder's name.
