HAS BEEN DEMANDED BY CABINET MINISTERS

Crown Prince May Ascend Throne--Precautions Taken to Prevent Riots in Capital.

Seoul, July 17 .- Following a cabine meeting yesterday which lasted four nours, the Premier had an audience with the Emperor in the evening, which ontinued three hours. It transpires the Premier made a strong worded representation of the gravity of the situation caused by his majesty's sending a deputation to the peace conference at The Hague. He boldly pointed out the necessity of the Emperor's abdication in favor of the Crown Prince and of his proceeding to Tokio and apologizing to the Emperor of Japan.
