Executive Committee of Earl Grey's **Dramatic** and Musical Competition Draws Applause

OTTAWA, March 27.-At a meeting

OTTAWA, March 27.—At a meeting of the executive committee of His Excellency's musical and theatrical trophy competition at Government House, it was decided in view of the success of the contest this year, to hold another of the same nature next year, and perhaps yearly thereafter.

Col. Hanbury Williams was again nominated chairman of the executive committee, and Mr. F. C. T. O'Hara, honorary secretary. The chairmen of the various committees are as follows: Competition Committee, Mr. J. S. Ewart, K. C.; Finance Committee, Mr. J. W. Woods; Reception and Entertainment Committee, Mr. C. Berkely Powell; Transportation Committee, Lt. Col. J. Lyons Biggar; Press Committee, Mr. E. Norman Smith.

Col. Hanbury Williams at the direction of His Excellency, has communicated with the Lieutenant-Governors of the various provinces, and the Governor-General of Newfoundland, asking their co-operation. It is proposed that provincial competitions should be held in charge of a provincial committee, the winners of which shall be eligible to compete at Ottawa. The date set for the opening of the Ottawa competition is February 24, 1908.

There is no population limit in the conditions which will shortly be issued, but it is intended that the provincial competitions shall be open to any amateur company in the province, irrespective of the town or city from which they come. One dramatic and one musical company will be eligible from each province as well as from Newfoundland, the only exception being that four companies, that is to say, two musical and two dramatic companies can enter from the provinces of Ontario and Quebec.
