SIR OLIVER MOWAT DEAD.

One of Canada's Greatest Political Figures

Passes to His Eternal Rest.

For Twenty-four Years Was Premier of Ontario and

Since Then Has Filled a Prominent Position

in the Wider Dominion Field--Will Be

Given a State Funeral.

Born at Kingston, Ontario, July 2nd, 1820. Read Law in office of Sir John A. Macdonald...

TORONTO, April 19.—Sir Oliver Mowat passed peacefully away at 8:45 this morning...

Arrangements were made for a state funeral by Premier Ross today. The body will lie in state in Government House from 2 to 5 p. m. Tuesday and 10.30 to 12.30 Wednesday morning.

TORONTO, April 19.—News of the death of Sir Oliver Mowat at 8:45 this morning spread through the city very rapidly...

Sir Oliver was born in Kingston, Ont., on July 2nd, 1820; his father, John Mowat, was a Scotchman...

He was a member of the Toronto City Council, where he rendered great service, representing St. Lawrence Ward in 1857, and the office of Attorney-General.
