**HYDRO-ELECTRIC STOCK SALE**

**LEGISLATURE WILL NOT DEAL WITH IT THIS YEAR—SUPREME COURT ASKED TO DECLARE SPERDAKES' SENTENCE EXCESSIVE.**

Fredericton, April 12.—The Corporation Committee met this morning, Mr. Slipp in the chair.

The bill to incorporate the New Brunswick Hydro-Electric Company was further considered. The committee met in private session and decided that the bill should be stood over till next session.

The bill to incorporate the New Brunswick Manganese Corporation, Limited, was not recommended.

Three city properties which formed a part of the estate of the late Chas. Scully were sold at public auction on the post office by Auctioneer D. J. Stockford. The Wright property on George street below Westmorland street, was withdrawn at \$1,900, the upset price, and Roadmaster Wm. McKay will become the owner of the property at that price. There was some lively bidding on the property on George street, numbers 550 and 552, which was sold to Mr. Scully, and it was finally bid in at \$2,300 by James Holland, acting for Harry C. McKay of the Board of Assessors. A small property on Smythe street, occupied by Joseph McLaughlin, was bid in by Robert Scott at \$600.

An assignment has been made by Michael Garrick, tailor, of St. Stephen, to M. McManis, K. C. Rev. J. A. Corbett of Hillsboro has been authorized to solemnize marriage.

Hon. John Morrissey, Chief Commissioner of Public Works, is calling for tenders for building the Church Brook concrete pipe culvert in Albert county.

The Supreme Court this morning, on resuming, took up the Crown paper. The first case argued was the case of P. J. Allen, commissioner, etc. of the parish of Westmorland, ex parte Thos. J. Gorman. The defendant had been convicted under the Canada Temperance Act, and A. B. Copp moved to quash the conviction. The chief argument in support of the contention was that the case after it had been started, was adjourned over to a certain date to 10 o'clock in the morning. In the meantime the attorney engaged agreed not to go on with the case until 2:30 p.m. The magistrate, however, opened court at 10 and took the evidence of witnesses in the absence of defendant. The magistrate, who presided on this ground, as the defendant had not an opportunity to cross-examine the witness, and the magistrate, K. C., opposed the application. The court said it would consider the case. It intimated, however, during the course of arguing or cross-examination, that the magistrate was within the discretion of the magistrate as to how he should conduct his court, and as the point raised did not go to the merits of the case, the court could not interfere with the decision. **DEATH SENTENCE ON MURDERER COMMUTED**

London, April 12.—The sentence of death imposed March 15 last, on Stile Morrison who after a sensational trial was found guilty of the murder of Joseph Beron, was commuted today to penal servitude for life. The mutilated body of Beron was found in a ditch common early in January. The police theory was that the victim was a member of the Houndsditch Anarchist burglar gang and that he had been killed by his associates for treachery. The evidence at the trial which occupied nine days was mostly circumstantial. Petition for the reprieve of Morrison was signed by 50,000 names.
