# YANKEE DOLLARS TO BUY CANADIAN SUPPORT FOR THE RECIPROCITY FOLLY

MISLEADING THE FARMER

Farmers who read pro-reciprocity papers should beware of the misleading use of figures and schedules made in presenting the reciprocity case. For example, one scheme is to head a list of changes, "Where the Farmer Stands to Gain in Buying." The list at a glance shows such items as "On binders from 17½ per cent. to 15 per cent.; on horse rakes, from 20 per cent. to 15 cent.; bells and gongs, 30 per cent. to 27½ per cent."

Many are persuaded that reciprocity will bring about what these figures appear to promise, and will be surprised to learn that the cut in each case is not from 20 to 15 per cent., or from 30 to 27½ per cent., but merely 5 per cent. or 2½ per cent., as the case may be, the duty being reduced, not the cut being made in prices, from 30 to 27½.

If the farmer thinks he is going to get a cut of 15 to 20 per cent. on implement prices he is simply misled. Even if he expects to get a cut of 2½ or 5 per cent., he is being deceived. The dealer will put that little profit in his pocket. It was only intended to have a quieting effect on the dealer anyway.
