

# ENIGMA OF ST. JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY

## Closing exercises of Golden Jubilee held yesterday in Lefebvre Hall - New course introduced.

St. Joseph, N. B., June 10.—This is the great day for the students of the university—encenia day, and there was the usual large attendance at the exercises. The following is the list of persons upon whom honorary degrees were conferred, graduates, and prize winners.
