"In the Riga sector there has been dolent reciprocal firing in the region of Ulloukst and south of Garbounds. In the region west of Kunhotz-Kuvalia, southwest of Pinsk, our scouts forced their way through extensive wire entanglements and killed or captured an entire enemy post.




