They are so afraid that the Canadians will be disappointed that they dread the king's intentions being announced at this distant date. A meet-ing between King George and President Wilson at Niagara Falls is likely to be uranged within the near future. "King George has intimated his willing-ness to open the Toronto exhibition in August, 1914, and preparations for this yent are already being made in English yourt circles. "It will be the first time that any King of England has visited Canada. It is hoped that the queen will accompany the ting, but nothing is yet definitely settled is regards this. 
