**SEALED TENDERS** addressed to the undersigned (Secretary of Railways and Canals) and endorsed "Tender for Lock Gates, Welland Canal," will be received at this office until the arrival of the Eastern and Western Mails on **THURSDAY the 23rd day of JUNE, next**, for the construction of gates and the necessary machinery connected with them, for the new locks on the Welland Canal.
