MACK, WILLIAM, J.P. (*Stormont.*)

Parents came to Can. from Lanarkshire, Scot., in 1828, and settled in the Co. of Huntingdon, P.Q. B. in Scot., 29 Feb., 1828, and ed. at the Common Sch. in Huntingdon. M., 10 May, 1855, Agnes, dau. of the late Wm. Henderson. Began the grist mill trade in Cornwall in 1849, at which he still continues. Has been a Councillor, Deputy-Reeve and Reeve of Cornwall, and Warden of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas, and Glengarry. First returned to Leg. Assem. for Cornwall, at g.e. 1879; defeated at g.e. 1883; re-elected for present seat at g.e. 1886, and again at last g.e.. A Reformer.—*Cornwall.*

MACKENZIE, CHARLES. (*West Lambton.*)

Youngest brother of Hon. Alexander Mackenzie, M.P. B. in 1833 at Dundirk, Perthshire, Scot. Came to Can. in 1842. Ed. at the Parish School. Is a hardware merchant and a dealer in oil. Was Warden of Lambton in 1888. First returned to Leg. Assem. at bye-election in 1889; re-elected at last g.e. A Reformer.—*Sarnia.*

MAGWOOD, THOMAS. (*North Perth.*)

B. 28 March, 1851, in East Flamboro Tp., of Irish parents. Is a farmer. Has been a councillor for six years and deputy reeve for four years of the Tp. of Mornington. First returned to Leg. Assem. at bye-election held Dec., 1890. A Reformer.—*Poole P.O.*

MARTER, GEORGE FREDERICK. (*Muskoka.*)

Eldest s. of the late Dr. Peter Marter, Brantford, Ont., a native of Eng., and first settled in St. John, N.B. B. in Brantford, 6 June, 1840, and ed. at the Grammar School there. M., 23 June, 1862, Mary A. Green, Windham. Is a merchant. Was clerk of Windham Tp. Council for ten years; a Councillor of Waterford, and Reeve of Gravenhurst for one year. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1886, and re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Gravenhurst, Ont.*

MEACHAM, WALTER WILLIAM, M.D. (*Lennox.*)
