

charge shall have been duly notified to remove therefrom, which penalty and forfeiture shall be recoverable from such Master, Owner, or other person in charge of such vessel or vessels as herein-after-mentioned, unless it shall appear that from some accident or unavoidable circumstance it has been out of the power of the Master, Owner, or other person in charge as aforesaid to remove the same, in which case such penalty and forfeiture shall only be recovered for the time which such vessel may have so remained after such accident or unavoidable circumstance shall have ceased to operate.

No boats loaded with firewood or hay to come into the landing place.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the passing of this Act, no boat or vessel loaded with firewood, wood or timber of any description, or hay, shall hereafter be permitted to enter or remain in the said Landing-place, and the Owner, Master, or other person in charge of such boat or vessel loaded with firewood, wood or timber of any description, or hay, who shall offer for sale, or shall sell or dispose of any firewood, wood or timber of any description in the said Landing-place, being previously warned not to offer for sale and sell the same, or who on receiving notice to remove such boat or vessel, loaded as aforesaid, from the said Landing-place shall refuse or neglect so to do as soon thereafter as the tide will permit, unless prevented by some accident or unavoidable necessity, shall incur a penalty and forfeiture for every such offence, not exceeding shillings, currency.

But they may go to the Cul-de-Sac and offer the same for sale.

III. Provided always and be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be lawful for such boats or vessels loaded as aforesaid, freely and without any charge, duty or impost whatever, to enter and remain in the place commonly called and known as the Cul-de-Sac, in the said Lower Town of Quebec, for the purpose of selling such firewood wood or timber of any description, or hay, and there to remain as long as may be necessary for that purpose, any law, usage, custom, regulation or ordinance, by any corporation or corporations, person or persons to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.
