

Students Want Board of Governors Seat

EDMONTON (CUP) — The University of Alberta students council wants student representation on the university's Board of Governors.

In a 9 to 6 vote October 25, the council accepted in principle a brief to the provincial government advocating that 25 per cent of the Board be composed of student representatives.

The Alberta government is now drafting changes in the University Act. According to the campus newspaper, The Gateway, it is rumored that the faculty will probably receive representation on the new Board of Governors.

Barry Kirkham, chairman of the council's committee on university government, said:

"We don't expect to run the show, but we do expect our ideas to be heard before vital decisions are taken."

He added that student participation in Board decisions would limit the necessity for protest marches even if their viewpoint was not accepted by the Board.

One councillor wondered whether students should have a say when they were attending university for only a short time.

Kirkham said, however, that any elected representative is transitory and that students were now making decisions affecting future students.

An editorial in The Gateway agreed that faculty and students "are being governed more and more by the computers and directives" of the administration, and should express their ideas on the board, but called the 25 per cent figure irresponsible.

science degree from UNB and an honorary doctor of civil law degree from Acadia.

Proposed Constitutional Changes

ARTICLE III — Section 1 — Delete all wording following "of his absence"

ARTICLE VI — Add: Section 14: The Public Relations Officer shall give notice of all regular and special meetings, nominations, and results of elections as hereinafter provided. He shall be directly responsible to the president for all publicity relating to the SRC.

ARTICLE IV — Standing Committees of the SRC. There shall be the following standing committees of the SRC with their duties being outlined in their respective constitutions being filed in the SRC office.

Section. I — (a) An Executive Committee (b) A Finance Committee (c) A Student Activity Awards Committee (d) A Constitution Committee (e) An Applications Committee (f) A Student Discipline Committee (g) A Delegation Selection Committee (h) An Education Committee

Section. II — Every Council member must be on at least one of the standing committees of the SRC.

ARTICLE VI — Section 2, Subsection (b) — DELETE!

ARTICLE VI — Section 8, Delete all wording following "of his absence"

ARTICLE VI — Add: Section 14: The Public Relations Officer shall give notice of all regular and special meetings, nominations, and results of elections as hereinafter provided. He shall be directly responsible to the president for all publicity relating to the SRC.

ARTICLE VII — Delete completely.

ARTICLE VIII — Section 1, Subsection (b) — Change from October 31st to November 1st.

ARTICLE VIII — Section 1, Subsection (c) — Students on presentation of their fees receipt shall receive a distinctive SRC card. This card must be returned to the SRC if the SRC fees are refunded.

ARTICLE VIII — Section 2 — Unless any student has the aforementioned card, he or she will not be allowed to participate in any SRC-sanctioned activities.

ARTICLE VIII — Section 3 — Change "Treasurer" to "Chairman of the Finance Committee".

ARTICLE IX — Delete Sections 2-13 (inclusive)

ARTICLE IX — Section 2, (new)

The Finance Committee is to be responsible for the formulation of Financial policies of the SRC and will be responsible for collection and disposal of SRC funds.

ARTICLE IX — Section 3. (new) All matters pertaining to Financial matters shall be set down in the Financial Committee Constitution.

ARTICLE XI — Section 10 — At the second meeting of the SRC, after they have taken office, and after the Fall budget meeting, the SRC Constitution shall be read and discussed by all members of the Council present. At the third meeting of the SRC after they have taken office and after the Final Fall Budget meeting, the SRC Constitution shall be read and discussed by all members of the Council present.

ARTICLE VIII — Sec. 4 — The Public Relations Officer shall have the duty of ordering and be responsible for the above-mentioned cards.
