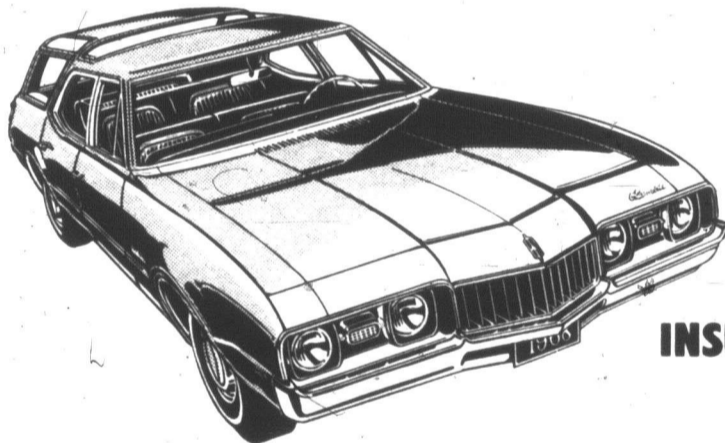
FIFTH INNING
