PORT CREDIT — A Port Credit resident who lives on the only unpayed piece of road in the west end of town now fears he will wind up paying for paying twice-over when the town is absorbed by

Mississauga.

Bruce Bottrell, who owns home sitting on property with 100 feet of frontage on Ben Machree Drive, appeared before Monday's regular council meeting to protest what appeared to him to be an inconsistency in town roads pol-

Ever since the mid-1960's when Port Credit adopted a repaving and road widening program, construction crews have worked east through the town. Despite the fact the second last area is now being finished (Area F'), Ben Machree near the western borders of Port Credit, has remained unpaved.

"I don't really care if it's paved or unpaved," Bottrell said, "but it will cost me monsaid, "but it will cost me money when a change in government comes." He estimates it could cost him up to \$1,200 if the road remains unpaved when either a regional government takes over or Mississauga absorbs Port Credit.

Mayor Cy Saddington told Bottrell he could not bind any future elected body, but he promised that if any council member were still around

member were still around when the town's status chang-ed he would fight for "Ben Machree's interests".

MISSISSAUGA — Two relatively minor accidents marred the traffic record of the Pert Credit detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police over the weekend. Damages from both are estimated at \$2,300.
On Friday afternoon police report Lynda Osborne of 3394 Mississauga Rd. was west-Mississauga Rd. was west-bound on Highway 5 near the Credit Woodlands when she stopped for traffic and was hit from behind by Mario Delben of 221 Troy Street in Port Credit.

Provincial Police Constable Ed Baker estimated damages at \$700 and charged Delben with careless driving. The woman complained of a sore neck from the impact.

Around noon on Saturday, police say Arthur Duquette of Brampton was northbound on Highway 10 at Derry Road West when he was struck by another northbound car driv-en by Gordon Hadley of Mal-

ton.

Hadley was charged with making an improper left turn from the wrong lane. Constable D. Smith estimated damages from the collision at \$1,800. A passenger in the Duquette vehicle, Graham Robinson, also of Brampton, received minor leg injuries.




