all of those four Liberal, except Dr. Spohn, it will be recalled, testified before the Hearing at Toronto. This makes ten Liberal complaintants.

To sum up;

We have ten medical officials who have been let out from the D.S.C.R. who complained of political partisanship.

In addition to these ten complaining Liberals comprising as they do prattically one-quarter of the 41 officials referred to, by Dr. Arnold there are four other medical officials who are still with the D.S.C.R., but who testified at the hearing at Toronto, that they have suffered from political partisanship namely, Dr. Royal Coutts, Dr. R.M. Campbell, Dr. J.D. Mills and Dr. John T. Courtice.

Reviewing the cases of those Liberals who have been let-out, or reduced to half-time chronologically, it will be noticed the evidence shows that Dr. Aylesworthy was let out in 1921; Dr. Spohn was let out and it was sought to reduce Dr. Mills to part time in 1922; Dr. A.A. Halliday was let out and it was sought to reduced Dr. J.T. Courtice in 1923; Dr. Elliott was let out and it was sought to let out Dr. D.M. Campbell in 1924; Dr. Manning was let out in 1925; Dr. Gunn was reduced to half-time in 1926.
