

OTTAWA, August 7th. 1926.

The Rt. Honourable Arthur Meighen, Portage La Prairie, MANITOBA.

Dear Mr. Meighen: -

I am to-day in receipt of a letter from Mr. Esling, Member for West Kootenay, indicating that wage earners, of whom there are very many in his riding on account of the mining industry, are concerned about the policy of your party respecting Old Age Pensions, and he asks that I get in touch with you and suggest to you an announcement on the subject. I am enclosing for your information Mr. Esling's letter, and a copy of my reply to it, which is self-explanatory and need not be enlarged upon.

Returning from Toronto this morning, I found that Mr. Blacklock left last night to join you in the West.
