Sir,-

Referring to your letter of the 5th ultimo I beg to inform you that Mr. Inspector J. Markle Red Deer Alberta, had the pieces of land in the Paul or White Whale Lake Indian Reserve on which crops were growing and were taken by the Canadian Northern Railway, measured carefully. The following are the measurements obtained;-

Jos. Mitchel, through oat field, 100' X 1000'

Ex-Cheif Paul, known also as Paul

Fire-bag, through oat field 100' X 100' and 23' X 450'


" turnips 23' X 100'

" Potatoes 50' X 100'

These are the only two claimants. The areas are less than those formerly mentioned, but they are greater than those of your Engineer.

Enclosed herewith is a sketch showing the location on the reserve of the cultivated land. I shall be obliged if you will come to an understanding with the said Mr. J. A. Markle as to the price that should be paid for the damages in question.
