I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 3rd instant, with which you forwarded Voucher No 60 for \$150.00 in favour of Mr Ashdown Green for services rendered as surveyor during April last; and in reply I beg to say that a cheque in payment of the said voucher has been sent as requested to the Bank of British North America, Duncan's Station, B.C.
